COMMUNICATION, Council President Saunders, to City Clerk Arruda, calling a SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL, for MONDAY, JUNE 08, 2009, at 6:45 p.m., in CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS, SECOND FLOOR OF CITY HALL, for the following: **AN ORDINANCE**, Amending Chapter 2, Section 2-157, Relative to Demolition Delay of Buildings and Structures (IN CITY COUNCIL, May 14, 2009- Passed to a Second Reading.) and **WRITTEN MOTION**, Councillor Gomes and Council President Saunders, requesting that the City Council go on record in support of keeping Eagle Industries and the 350 jobs here, that at the present time may be transferred to Puerto Rico, with the closing of the plant on July 31, 2009; further requesting, that the City Council go on record in support of the Congressional Delegation in Washington D.C., especially Congressman Frank, in anyway possible that they can keep the jobs here, whether it is speaking to the United States Army or the Department of Commerce and Labor on the Federal level, and that the City Council and the Administration be available to provide any assistance in order to keep Eagle Industries and jobs here in the City of New Bedford; further requesting, that a letter be sent to President Barack Obama and his staff notifying them of Eagle Industries plan to leave the City creating a large increase in unemployment in the City, which it cannot at this time withstand and requesting that the President and his Department of Commerce & Labor Executives do whatever they can in order to keep Eagle Industries in New Bedford, even if it means that their Government Contracts be suspended due to the fact of the Company leaving; and further requesting, that the City Council support Congressman Frank and the Administration's efforts to secure a buyer or support a prospective buyer, in any way possible, to keep those 350 jobs here in the City of New Bedford, jobs which mainly employ the Portuguese, Cape Verdean and Hispanic people of our community.
