WRITTEN MOTION, Councillor Gomes and Council President Duarte, requesting, that the Committee on Ordinances and Legal Counsel Gerwatowski take immediate action and draft an Ordinance that would create curfew zones throughout the City of New Bedford targeting hot spots and areas where criminal activity has affected the quality of life within the neighborhoods, these curfew zones would be from dusk to dawn and be implemented as needed throughout the City; and further, this would give the Police Department and the City a tool in eliminating the criminal activity occurring in neighborhoods across the City which is affecting the quality of life of the residents of those neighborhoods.
