**MEETING: COMMITTEE ON ORDINANCES**

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Councillor Martins called the Ordinance Committee Meeting to order and took attendance. Memo's from Councillors Alves and Lawrence were read into the record stating they would not be in attendance due to prior commitments and a Memo from Councillor Duarte stating he would be late in attending was also read into the record and these memo's were received and placed on file by Councillor Lopes and seconded by Councillor Oliveira.

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Notice, City Clerk of reference of a PUBLIC HEARING on a Communication, Mayor Mitchell, to City Council, submitting a request on behalf of the Massachusetts Clean Energy Center, which is currently in the process of redeveloping the South Terminal, that Lot 234, on Assessor's Map 31, be rezoned in its entirety to Waterfront Industrial, the proposed zoning change will bring consistency in the zoning on the lot and in the South Terminal Area (Ref'd 11/14/13, duly advertised in the Standard-Times on November 27, 2013 and December 4, 2013) and a Communication, City Planner Jill Maclean to Councillor Steven Martins, Chairman, Committee on Ordinances, notifying the Committee that the Planning Board held a Public Hearing on December 11, 2013 to discuss the proposed zoning requesting that Plot 31, Lot 234 (ES R South Front Street) be rezoned in its entirety to Waterfront Industrial from a current mix of Waterfront Industrial and Industrial Districts to bring consistency on the lot and in the South Terminal Area. The Planning Board voted to send a **FAVORABLE RECOMMENDATION** to the Ordinance Committee (12/11/13) were received and placed on file by Councillor Lopes and seconded by Councillor Coelho. The Chair opened the hearing. (1, 1a)

City Planner Jill Maclean explained that there was a very brief discussion about this at the Planning Board meeting. She stated that this is the lot with the radio tower in the south end of the city, and they are looking to make the lots consistent for the South Terminal South.

Councillor Lopes asked Attorney David Gerwatowski if this was, in his opinion, spot zoning. Attorney Gerwatowski stated that in his opinion, it is not spot zoning.

No one spoke in favor or wished to be recorded in favor. No one spoke in or was recorded in opposition. The hearing was closed.

On motion by Councillor Bousquet and seconded by Councillor Oliveira, the Committee VOTED: To recommend to the City Council ADOPTION of the Zoning Ordinance for Map 31 Lot 234 Located East of South Front Street Rear from Industrial "B" to Waterfront Industrial. This motion passed on a Roll Call Vote of Yeas 6, Nays 0.

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Notice, City Clerk of reference of a PUBLIC HEARING, on a Communication, Mayor Mitchell, to City Council, submitting AN ORDINANCE, amending Chapter 9, Section 1200 by updating the definition of Wireless Communication Service and updating Chapter 9, Section 4900 by revising and modernizing the requirements for future wireless communication facilities in the City by amending Sections 4946, 4951 and 4952 (Ref'd 11/14/13, duly advertised in the Standard-Times on November 27, 2013 and December 4, 2013) and a Communication, City Planner Jill Maclean to Councillor Steven Martins, Chairman, Committee on Ordinances, notifying the Committee that the Planning Board held a Public Hearing on December 11, 2013 to discuss the proposed Ordinance to Amend Chapter 9, Section 1200, Wireless Communication Services and updating Chapter 9, Section 4900, by revising and modernizing the requirements for future wireless communications facilities in the City by amending Sections 4946, 4951, and 4952. The Planning Board voted to send a **FAVORABLE RECOMMENDATION** to the Ordinance Committee (12/11/13) was received and placed on file by Councillor Bousquet and seconded by Councillor Gonsalves. The Chair opened the hearing. (2, 2a, 2b)

Jill Maclean, City Planner, stated that this is essentially bringing the city zoning code up to speed with technology.

No one spoke or wished to be recorded either in favor or opposition. The Hearing was closed.

On motion by Councillor Lopes and seconded by Councillor Bousquet, the Committee VOTED: To recommend to the City Council Adoption of the ORDINANCE, amending Chapter 9, Section 1200 by updating the definition of Wireless Communication Service and updating Chapter 9, Section 4900 by revising and modernizing the requirements for future wireless communication facilities in the City by amending Sections 4946, 4951 and 4952. This motion passed on a Roll Call Vote of Yeas 6, Nays 0.

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Notice, City Clerk of reference of a PUBLIC HEARING, on a Written Motion, Councillor Gonsalves, on behalf of Joe and Ana Vinagre of 5 Bay Street, requesting that the portion of the property located at 44 Dartmouth Street (Plot 36/Lot 19) that is zoned Residential be rezoned to MIXED-USE BUSINESS so that the zoning is consistent for the entire property (Ref'd 10/24/13, duly advertised in the Standard-Times on November 27, 2013 and December 4, 2013) and a Communication, City Planner Jill Maclean to Councillor Steven Martins, Chairman, Committee on Ordinances, notifying the Committee that the Planning Board held a Public Hearing on December 11, 2013 to discuss the proposed rezoning of Plot 36, Lot 19 in its entirety to Mixed-Use Business from a current mix of Mixed-Use and Residential B. The Planning Board voted to send a **FAVORABLE RECOMMENDATION** to the Ordinance Committee (12/11/13) were received and placed on file by Councillor Gonsalves and seconded by Councillor Bousquet. The Chair opened the hearing. (3, 3a)

Jill Maclean stated that this lot is between a Residence "B" area and a Mixed Use area, and this will be making the lot in question consistent with the actual use of the property.

Speaking in favor was Mr. Joe Vinagre, the property owner who did not realize that part of his property was not zoned correctly.

No one was recorded in favor. No one spoke or wished to be recorded in opposition. The Hearing was closed.

On motion by Councillor Gonsalves and seconded by Councillor Lopes, the Committee VOTED: To recommend to the full City Council ADOPTION, of the rezoning of the portion of the property located at 44 Dartmouth Street, Plot 36, Lot 19, from Residential "B" to Mixed-Use Business. This motion passed on a Roll Call Vote of Yeas 6, Nays 0.

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Notice, City Clerk of reference of a WRITTEN MOTION, Councillor Saunders, requesting that Plot 100, Lot 139 (N.S. Davis Street) be REZONED from MIXED USE BUSINESS to INDUSTRIAL B (Ref'd 9/12/13, 10/16/13 – Hearing held item remains in Committee) and a Communication, Planning Board to Councillor Steven Martins, Chairman, Committee on Ordinances, notifying the Committee that the Planning Board held a Public Hearing on October 9, 2013, to discuss the proposed zoning change of Plot 100/Lot 139, Davis Street from “MIXED USE BUSINESS” (MUB) to “INDUSTRIAL B” (IB); the Planning Board voted to send a **UNFAVORABLE RECOMMENDATION** to the Ordinance Committee. On motion by Councillor Lopes and seconded by Councillor Coelho, the Committee VOTED: To table this matter at this time. This motion passed on a voice vote.

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Notice, City Clerk of reference of a WRITTEN MOTION, Councillors Coelho, Oliveira and Martins, requesting that the Committee on Ordinances and the Commissioner of Buildings and Inspectional Services, review zoning laws, specifically Chapter 9 §2300 through §2325 regarding accessory uses, as such Sections that relate to the operation of Day Care Facilities, and determine the purpose of said Ordinance and whether the purpose is being served by the enforcement of the Ordinance on the various Day Care Facilities throughout the City; and further, that the review also include an analysis of any public impact that repealing the requirement for Day Care Operators to acquire a Special Permit through the Zoning Board of Appeals would have on City residents and neighborhoods, or if any other adverse effects would result from such a repeal (Ref'd 8/13/13) and a COMMUNICATION, Mayor Mitchell, to City Council, submitting legal constraints faced by the City under the current Home Day-Care Facilities Ordinance and the Special Permit requirements (Ref'd 8/13/13) were received and placed on file by Councillor Lopes and seconded by Councillor Coelho. (5, 5a)

Dan Romanowicz, DIS Commissioner, gave background on this item and how it became so controversial. He stated that at this time, there seems to be an impasse. The ZBA voted to reduce the Special Permit fees, going from \$800 down to \$400 and down again to \$385.

Councillor Coelho wondered whether the Committee should delay this for 90 days and give it some more thought as to what the best solution might be.

Councillor Gonsalves asked Mr. Romanowicz if this permit and fee were put into place back in 2003 and he replied that it was.

Mr. Romanowicz further explained that any home-based business that draws people to the residence is now required to apply for this permit. This was put in place because people were opening up Day Care Centers in their homes without any public notification or hearing process and neighbors were complaining. He stated that now, approximately 2-3 home-based businesses apply to the ZBA for the Special Permit each year.

There was discussion as to whether or not the requirement of the Special Permit should be eliminated all together.

Councillor Gonsalves cautioned against that, saying that she receives numerous calls about illegally operated home-based businesses all the time, and that it is a very big problem throughout the city. She stated that zoning is in place to protect neighborhoods, business districts, etc.

Councillor Coelho made a motion to ask Attorney Gerwatowski to draft an Ordinance deleting the Special Permit requirement for Home Day Care providers, but no second was made.

Councillor Lopes made a motion to waive the Special Permit requirement for Day Care facilities that were in existence and operating on or before June 30, 2013, which was seconded by Councillor Coelho.

Councillor Oliveira made a friendly amendment to the motion to add that the Moratorium be extended for 120 days or until such time that the new Ordinance is in place, which was seconded by Councillor Coelho.

On motion by Councillor Lopes and seconded by Councillor Coelho, the Committee VOTED: That the City Council waive the Special Permit requirement for Day Care facilities that were in existence and operating on or before June 30, 2013 and that the Moratorium be extended for 120 days or until such time that the new Ordinance is in place. This motion passed on a voice vote.

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Notice, City Clerk of reference of a COMMUNICATION, Mayor Mitchell, to City Council, submitting AN ORDINANCE, amending Section 19-135.2 to establish EMS rates that are equal to the Medicare National Fee Schedule +125% rate for ambulance services (Ref'd 9/12/13) was received and placed on file by Councillor Bousquet and seconded by Councillor Coelho. Attorney Gerwatowski recommended that the Committee move to strike the words "requested by the Mayor and approved by the City Council" and insert in place thereof the words, "granted pursuant to local residency ordinances".

On motion by Councillor Gonsalves and seconded by Councillor Coelho, the Committee VOTED: To strike the words "requested by the Mayor and approved by the City Council" and insert in place thereof the words, "granted pursuant to local residency ordinances". This motion passed on a voice vote.

On motion by Councillor Coelho and seconded by Councillor Bousquet, the Committee VOTED: To recommend to the City Council ADOPTION of the REVISED ACT, AS AMENDED, relating to the Harbormaster of the City of New Bedford, the proposed Act authorizes the Mayor with the approval of the City Council to appoint a Harbormaster, who shall be a resident and registered voter of the City, unless a Residency Waiver is granted pursuant to local residency ordinances, said appointment shall be for a term of not more than five years. This motion passed on a voice vote.

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Councillor Martins asked the Committee's clarification on items eight (8) through thirty-nine (39).
