ORDERED, that the City appropriates the amount of Twelve Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$12,500,000.00) for the purpose of constructing, equipping, and furnishing an addition to the existing SeaLab facility, located at 71 Portland street in New Bedford, to be known as Taylor School at SeaLab, including all costs incidental or related thereto, which school facility shall have an anticipated useful life as an educational facility for the instruction of school children for at least 50 years, and for which the city is eligible for a grant from the Massachusetts School Building Authority (“MSBA”). To meet this appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor and the Committee on Finance, is authorized to borrow said sum of money, pursuant to M.G.L. Chapter 44, or pursuant to any enabling

authority. The City acknowledges that the MSBA grant program is a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need, as determined by the MSBA, and that any project costs the City incurs in excess of any grant approved and received from the MSBA shall be the sole responsibility of the City; provided further that any grant that the City may receive from the MSBA for this project shall not exceed the lesser of (1) 90 percent (%) of eligible, approved project costs, as determined by the MSBA, or (2) the total maximum grant amount determined by the MSBA; and the amount of borrowing authorized pursuant to this Order shall be reduced by the grant amount set forth in any Project Funding Agreement or other similar agreement that may be executed by the City and the MSBA with respect to this project.

FURTHER ORDERED, that the Treasurer is authorized to file an application with the appropriate officials of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (“Commonwealth”) to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds of the City authorized by this Order, and to provide such information and execute such documents as officials of the Commonwealth may require in execution herewith.
