WHEREAS, After a successful career as a community organizer, Corinn Williams changed direction and committed herself to helping New Bedford's struggling immigrant population; and

WHEREAS, In 1993, Corinn Williams began working at People Acting in Community Endeavors (PACE), one of the area's largest agencies combating poverty, and in 1997, along with William Maddocks, co-founded Community Economic Development Center of Southeastern Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, By 2002, William Maddocks had left the Community Economic Development Center and Corinn Williams had taken charge; and

WHEREAS, Under Corinn Williams' leadership, the Community Economic Development Center shifted much of its focus to the immigrant community, a vulnerable segment of any City's population and for New Bedford's immigrants, the Community Economic Development Center became and has remained a venue for advice and assistance with family or personal concerns, employment training or any issue they feel they might need guidance with, the CEDC has become the major support center for the immigrant community from Central America; and

WHEREAS, The Community Economic Development Center provides interpreter and translation services, legal counseling, youth services, assistance with housing, healthcare and benefit eligibility services, founded in 1997, as a Community Development Corporation in New Bedford, for community revitalization through innovative community-based economic development programs and affordable housing targeted to low and moderate income members of local communities, the CEDC serves thousands of area residents; and

WHEREAS, For her leadership in assisting New Bedford's poor and immigrant population in her position as Executive Director of the Community Economic Development Center and her determination to make a difference in the community, Corinn Williams has been selected the Standard-Times 2014 Woman of the Year:

COMMUNICATION/DEMOLITION, New Bedford Historical Commission, to City Council, re: BUILDING DEMOLITION REVIEW, 26 MADEIRA AVENUE, Map 104, Parcel 6: constructed in 1918, the Sarah D. Ottiwell

School was designed by locally known architect, Louis E. Destremps in the Italian Renaissance style; typical of the Italian Renaissance style, the building has a stucco finish and a false roof overhang that showcases the style's typical tile roofing and brackets, the west façade elevation on Madeira Avenue is a relatively simple arch doorway accented by classical columns, Fresco panels can be found above the door entries, the frescoes feature children, befitting of a school building in which they inhabited; the subject building was named in honor of Sarah D. Ottiwell, a New Bedford educator who devoted her life to the education of children in the community for sixty years and the building is in a deteriorated condition and the original windows have been replaced” and therefore, “the NBHC has determined that 26 Madeira Avenue is a historically significant structure but not preferably preserved.” (Copy all Councillors via email 01/13/2015.)
