# HOMELESS?

**Are you experiencing homelessness?  
Don't have anywhere to go?

There is ONE phone number to call for help anywhere in Bristol County—**The CALL** [Coordinated Access to Local Links].

You can no longer call individual agencies to try and get in their shelter programs. As of December 1st, 2015, everyone and every agency in New Bedford [and all of Bristol county] is using ONE phone number to connect folks to the shelter they need.

You must call this number from a local area code; that means it will only work if you call from a phone with a 508 or 774 area code.
