Dear Ms. Goldman,

This letter is to notify you that at the Conservation Commission meeting of August 27th, 2019, the Conservation Commission considered your request to leave the platypus anchors in place during the off season. In the correspondence received on August 27th, 2019 from Altitude H2O it was stated that the water park would be returning to East Beach. Altitude H2O is looking to minimize disturbance to the beach and sea floor by leaving the platypus anchors in place rather than utilizing a boat and crane to pull the anchors from their location or dig down the 2 meters they are submerged to free them should a cable fail during crane removal.

The Conservation Commission agreed that since you are returning, it would minimize disturbance to the sea floor to leave the anchors in place. Altitude H2O shall remove the anchor lines and thread marine grade stainless steel cable through all of the anchor loops located at the sea floor. The cable ends will be connected, and it will sit on the sea floor allowing sand and silt to wash over it. Two 8” underwater marker buoys shall mark the location so that the cable can be found when it is time to install the water park.
