Subject: Brush Piles

Hi Sarah,

Good to talk to you today regarding the upcoming Tuesday Conservation Commission Meeting where we are requested to address the brush piles. Either Mr. Hopps or I will attend the meeting (weather permitting since we may have to deal with a tropical storm).

Since I have not seen the letter you mentioned that was sent to Elm Street, Dartmouth, can you send me a copy for my records?

One September 10th I talked with one of the residents of the house that borders the back of Lot 6 to discuss the items that were dumped on the lot including the brush pile and the concern by the Conservation office. They said that it was possible that they might have left some items on the lot but the area has been used as a dumping ground for years before we started our development and they don't think they were responsible for all items. On September 13th I traveled outside the US and returned on September 27th. I have been under the weather all week but went out to the site on September 29th to see what if anything the neighbors had done in my absence. The neighbors did remove the metal ladder and other metal pieces but didn't touch the brush pile.

After talking to you today, about the brush pile behind the building site on lot 6 and a new brush pile on lot 5, I went out to look at them both. Given the upcoming inclement weather and potential tropical storm, I don't think we can remove them before the Tuesday meeting, however, we will remove both piles from these areas before the end of next week weather permitting. As I have said before, we want to work with the Conservation Commission as we continue to develop these properties.
