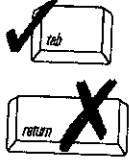

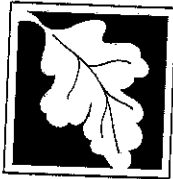

2. Extent and Type of Activity (if more space is required, please attach a separate sheet):

On March 11, 2019 an employee of the City of New Bedford Dept. of Public Infrastructure witnessed and photographed Fall River Ready-Mix concrete trucks washing concrete slurry wastewater into Bordering Vegetated Wetland (BVW) and associated 100' Buffer Zone The D.P.I. employee spoke to the Fall River Ready-Mix employees that they were discharging into protected Wetlands and that this was prohibited. Fall River Ready-Mix continued to wash out their trucks. The Conservation Agent for the City of New Bedford visited the site the following day and discovered evidence of concrete in and adjacent to the BVW.

B. Findings

The Issuing Authority has determined that the activity described above is in a resource area and/or buffer zone and is in violation of the Wetlands Protection Act (M.G.L. c. 131, § 40) and its Regulations (310 CMR 10.00), and the New Bedford Wetlands Ordinance because:



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the activity has been/is being conducted in an area subject to protection under c. 131, § 40 or the buffer zone without approval from the issuing authority (i.e., a valid Order of Conditions or Negative Determination).

No further work shall be performed until a public hearing has been held and an Order of Conditions has been issued to regulate said work.

The property owner shall take the following action (e.g., erosion/sedimentation controls) to prevent further violations of the Act:

The violator (Fall River Ready – Mix Concrete) shall remove the concrete deposits in the BVW and adjacent Buffer Zone. The concrete shall be removed with hand tools such as shovels. Pink spray paint marks the general locations of the concrete to be removed. The extent of the concrete removal shall be discussed at an on-site meeting with the Conservation Agent prior to the removal of the concrete. The Conservation Agent (Sarah Porter 508-991-6188) shall be notified 48 hours in advance of the concrete removal. All concrete shall be removed by April 26th, 2019. Fall River Ready-Mix shall notify/coordinate with the City of New Bedford Dept. of Public Infrastructure prior to removing the concrete from their R.O.W.

Failure to comply with this Order may constitute grounds for additional legal action. Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 131, Section 40 provides: "Whoever violates any provision of this section (a) shall be punished by a fine of not more than twenty-five thousand dollars or by imprisonment for not more than two years, or both, such fine and imprisonment; or (b) shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars for each violation". Each day or portion thereof of continuing violation shall constitute a separate offense.

D. Appeals/Signatures

An Enforcement Order issued by a Conservation Commission cannot be appealed to the Department of Environmental Protection, but may be filed in Superior Court.
