**Club Recordacoes De Portugal, Inc. Antonio DaSilva, President** who is petitioning to **Change the Description of the Club All Alcoholic Beverages License**, as a result of planned renovations. Upon completion of the renovations, the new description of the licensed premises will include two rooms on the first floor of a one-story building in a total area approximately 6,600 sq. ft., which will include one room, approximately 5,300 sq. ft., that will be used as a function hall, and will include a bar area, stage, and two restrooms; there will also be an additional room, approximately 1,300 sq. ft., that will be used as a ‘Club Member’s Lounge’, and will include a seated bar area and five (5) tables as well as a small storage room. This room will have a member’s only entrance/exit onto Coggeshall Street as well as an additional entrance/exit through the main foyer on Coggeshall Street and two (2) entrances/exits into the function hall area. The function room will have two (2) additional entrances/exits that will lead into the club parking lot on North Front Street, as well as an emergency exit on both the North and East side of the building. The licensed premises will also include the basement area which includes a kitchen area, locker room, and an additional area for the storage of alcohol only; as well as a walk-in cooler also for the storage of alcohol only. **There is to be no service (sale) or consumption of alcohol in the basement area.** The premises will remain situated on the North side of Coggeshall Street between North Front Street and Belleville Avenue, and will remain **numbered 249-253 Coggeshall Street**.

Final approval will require a new ‘**Certificate of Inspection**’ from the Building Department, a new ‘**Food Permit**’ from the Health Department, and a new signed ‘**Fire & Building Certificate**’ with regard to Chapter 304 Fire Acts Compliance.

**Present: Atty. Daniel DeNardis along with Antonio DaSilva, President.**

Atty. DeNardis stated on behalf of his client, some of the younger people who are now there want to move the club forward ... they want to renovate the club ... put money into the club ... they’re doing this stuff on their own ... and I think this would be helpful not only to the Portuguese community ... given the age of this club (85 years in existence) and what it stands for ... but also for the area down there ... they want to make things accessible on the first floor ... if you’ve been down there before ... you’ll know how disjointed it is with the upstairs and the downstairs ... they understand what has to be done to keep it separate and apart with regard to the service of alcohol ... and that it can only be used for the storage of alcohol ... and that alcohol cannot be served or consumed downstairs ... and the upstairs, once renovated ... I think what their planning is exciting.

Chairman Beaugard stated that he did a walkthrough with Mr. Silva, and he had no problem with the proposed plan.

**Present: Brian Costa and Eric Paradis, Representatives**

When asked by Chairman Beaugard to give the Board an overview of the event, Mr. Paradis stated, that this is our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual event ... we plan on having about 170 people down on Pier 3 ... we’re sharing a tent with United Way of Greater New Bedford that weekend ... we’re going to have two stages for six bands ... we’re also going to have food trucks also present ... we’re going to have a full bar, which will include beer and wine, and a limited amount of mixed drinks ... all proceeds of the event go to support Your Theatre, Inc.

Responding to questions from Chairman Beaugard, Mr. Paradis stated that Freitas Package Store would be providing the alcohol, as well as their own bartenders to serve the alcohol; and that they would have a pouring station set up.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to how they planned to control the flow of alcohol and conduct I.D. checks, Mr. Paradis stated, we’re going to bottle neck the entrance to the pier from the two sides from which you can get onto the pier ... we’ve already requested ‘riot horses’ from the city to help corner off the areas ... so that we can have everyone come in from the street entrance near the Warfinger Building where we will have a table set up for check in .... Where I.D.’s will be checked and appropriate bracelets will be given ... and stamp will be given to those entering that area 21+ ... and the bartenders will reserve the right to double check anyone’s I.D. at the bar.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard, as to why they were using a hand stamp instead of a wristband to identify, Mr. Paradis responded, everyone will receive a wristband to indicate that they are a guest at the Jazz Fest ... and a stamp will be given on top of that.

Chairman Beaugard responding to the use of a hand stamp, that makes it difficult for the police to monitor and control an event relative to those 21+ ... we’ve always requested that wristbands be used for larger events ... so that anybody that is not is very identifiable ... it works very well for at the feast and other events ... I would rather that you go that route than using a stamp ... if you do a good job of getting them into the tent by cornering off the entrance ... then you should not have any problems with anyone being in there that’s a non-paying attendee.

Commissioner Craig offered that they stamp everybody that’s paid and put a wristband on everyone’s that’s 21+, to which Mr. Paradis responded, we can do that, if that’s what the Board would like us to do.

After further discussion, it was agreed that wristbands would be issued, and would be affixed on the right hand, since the police have been trained to look at the right hand, if someone looks under 21 years of age, to see if they have a wristband.

**Present: Pamela Pinault, Manager/Co-Owner and Lucy Langevin, Co-Owner**

When asked by Chairman Beaugard to give the Board an overview of the event, Ms. Pinault stated, we’re hosting an event that will be part of the Southcoast Equality Pride Day that will be held in the city that day ... we’ve requested a one block street closing from North Front Street to Belleville Avenue on Washburn Street in front of LePlace ... which would have one entrance on the top and one entrance on the bottom ... and that alcohol would be served from inside the bar but would be allowed to be taken outside into that enclosed area as well as the already approved outdoor patio area ... like a

block party ... and there will be a stage for entertainment set up in the parking lot ... and that they would have Police Officers posted at each end of the street to ensure that alcohol doesn't leave the area, as well as their own security ... and that they would also have signs posted with regard to alcohol not being allowed to leave the area, as well as having trash barrels at the exits for the disposal of all drink containers, prior to leaving the area ... and last call would be called outside at 9:30 p.m., with the outside area being shut down at 10:00 p.m. ... at which time the street will be re-opened.

Responding to further questions from Chairman Beaugard, Ms. Pinault stated that their bartenders will be serving the alcohol from the inside bar, and there would not be any alcohol sold in that outside area ... just consumed in the enclosed area ... and that they would have at least two police detail officers.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard, as to how many people they anticipated at the event, Ms. Pinault responded, hopefully 250.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard what their occupancy was inside, Ms. Pinault responded, ninety-nine.

Chairman Beaugard responded, so you're not sprinklered ... so what happens to those 250 people at 10 o'clock when you shut down outside and open up the street ... where do those people go?

Chairman Beaugard informed them in way of as an example, if you have 50 people inside at 10:00 p.m. ... then only 49 more can be allowed in ... you can't go over your 99 capacity number ... you're going to have to turn some people away at that point, so you're not in violation.

Both Ms. Pinault and Ms. Langevin stated that they understood.

Responding to questions from Chairman Beaugard, Ms. Rocha stated that she's been involved with this event in the past but not as the President; and that she's recently taken over that position from Mr. Matos, and that she's been there for three years ... she also stated nothing has changed with regard to this year's event with regard to food, entertainment, and the service of alcohol ... everything will be the same ... and that she was aware of the issue with the stage and that it will facing out towards Acushnet Avenue, as previously requested by the Board.

Det. Fredericks stated that they haven't had any problems in the past.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard to give the Board an overview of the event, Mr. Furtado responded, I sponsor multiple soccer teams for kids out of my Soccer Academy ... and I'm looking to hold a 'fundraiser' in my parking lot with a band ... and we're looking to have it both inside the building ... and outside in the parking lot, which will closed off with wooden horses ... and the band will be outside in the parking lot ...

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to how much of the parking lot he was looking to close off, Mr. Furtado responded, the whole thing.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard, if there would be any parking allowed in that lot, Mr. Furtado responded, No, because we have another lot on the other side for people to use.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to how many people he expected would attend, Mr. Furtado responded, maybe 200...250.

Chairman Beaugard questioned if there was enough parking on the other side of the building to handle 200 people; to which Mr. Furtado responded, when we have our indoor soccer league games, we have about 30-40 cars parked back there.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard if they would be parking in the street, Mr. Furtado responded, not in the street.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard, Where are you going to be serving the alcohol from? Mr. Furtado responded, that the alcohol would be served from the snack bar area of the academy but those attending would be allowed to bring the alcohol (Wine & Malt Only) outside to listen to the music, and purchase food; and that the alcohol would be served in plastic cups.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard if he planned on having a Police Detail, Mr. Furtado stated that he is, and that he would also be issuing wristbands.

When he was asked by Chairman Beaugard as to how he planned to check I.D.'s and issue wristbands, Mr. Furtado stated that a gate would be set up in the parking lot where I.D.'s would be checked and wristbands would be issued to those attending that are 21+.

When asked By Chairman Beaugard if there would be people attending under the age of 21, Mr. Furtado stated that there would be.

After discussing the matter with Chairman Beaugard, Mr. Furtado agreed that there would be one entrance/exit coming into the parking lot where I.D.'s would be checked and wristbands issued, and there would also be a double check at the door that leads to the snack bar.

When asked by Commissioner Craig as to who would be providing the alcohol, Mr. Furtado responded, Horizon Beverage.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to who would be serving (pouring the alcohol), Mr. Furtado stated that Horizon

would be providing the servers; Chairman Beaugard instructed Mr. Furtado to verify that Horizon would be providing servers, and to let Mr. Nanopoulos know.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to who will be checking the I.D.'s and issuing the wristbands, Mr. Furtado stated that they would be using people from their organization; and added that he used to have a liquor license (Sporting Soccer Club, Inc.), and was familiar with the procedure with regard to checking I.D.'s.

Mr. Perry continued his presentation by stating, I don't know if you're familiar with it ... it's the old Morse Cutting Tools lot ... and the area we are looking to use is on the Pleasant Street side of that lot between Wing and Bedford Streets ... and we're requesting to serve beer and wine in that area ... we will have a Police Detail in that area ... there are two entrances/exits on each end of Pleasant Street ... we will also intend to put barrels with signs ... and there's a fence along the backside of the drinking area, which will serve to enclose the backside of the area ... and the street will be closed and blocked off on each end to enclose the entire area ... and we will also have another barrier, which will enclose the area in approximately 150' x 20' in which the alcohol will be served and consumed ... and the area will be staffed with 5-10 members along with the Detail Officer ... it's going to be a tightly enclosed area, so we can monitor the serving of the alcohol.

The site plan was then reviewed with the Board in detail.

Chairman Beaugard voiced his concern that those purchasing alcohol could walk up into the carnival area, and requested that some type of orange snow fencing be used to somehow delineate that area.

Ms. Rogers stated that they had orange fencing, and it was agreed that would it be used.

Chairman Beaugard also suggested, I think that you should use one color cups for the drinks you're serving ... so if someone is outside that area ... the Police Officers will know ... and they can tell them to move back into the allowed area or have them pour out the drinks on the grass.

Mr. Perry also stated that they will be issuing wristbands, and that all there servers are S.T.O.P. and T.I.P.S. Certified. Chairman Beaugard also suggested that there will a lot of people walking around, and they should be mindful not to allow anyone into that area with alcohol.
