APPROVALS RECEIVED FROM THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES CONTROL COMMISSION

‘New’ Retail Package Store Wine & Malt Only License - Trans. #225 – Plot # 35--48

Allen Street Convenience, Inc., Jose M. Raposo, President, who is petitioning for a **New Retail Package Store Wine and Malt Only Beverages License**. **Jose M. Raposo** is the President, Treasurer, Secretary, Sole Director, Sole Shareholder (100%), and **Proposed Manager**. The proposed licensed premises is a convenience store located on the 1st floor of a two-story building in an area approximately 840 sq. ft., which will include a walk-in cooler for the storage of alcohol, as well as coolers (3) and shelving for the sale and display of alcohol; the area also includes an office, a storage room, and one restroom. Alcohol will also be stored in the basement. There is one (1) entrance/exit in the front of the building, as well as one exit located at the rear of the building. The premise is situated on the southeast corner of Allen and Oak Streets, **and numbered 282 Allen Street**. Final approval will require a **‘Certificate of Inspection’** from the Building Department.

New “Seasonal” License - Trans. #227 – Plot # 12—287 – LATE FILE

The Edge Hospitality, LLC d/b/a The Edge-Tiki Bar, which is petitioning for a **New ‘Seasonal’ Common Victualler (Restaurant) All Alcoholic Beverages License** under M.G.L. Chapter 138, sec.12. Margaret Kulpinski is the Sole Member, Sole Manager, and Sole Interest Holder of the LLC. **Antonio E. Hernandez, Jr.** is the **Proposed Manager of the Liquor License**. The proposed licensed premise consists of an area approximately 3,000 sq. ft. which will be enclosed by a 4 ft. high jersey barrier, with breaks in the barrier to allow ingress and egress. The enclosed area will contain a wood ‘Tiki’ bar structure approximately 150 to 200 sq. ft. (approx. 19’ x 8’), which will contain refrigeration, sinks, and a locked storage area to maintain alcohol, and 15 to 17 tables for dining, with a total seating capacity for 75 patrons.

The enclosed area, which will be approximately 150 ft. from the existing building, will be located on the east end of the parking lot, and numbered **1480-S East Rodney French Boulevard**.

Final approval will require a **‘Certificate of Inspection’** from the Building Department, a **‘Food Permit’** from the Health Department, and **‘Proof of Liquor Liability’**.

NOTE: The Seasonal License for this location was approved with the following terms and stipulations:

TERMS AS REQUIRED BY THE M.G.L. AND ABCC

1. Alcohol to be sold in this area must be purchased separately from a distributor, and cannot be taken out of stock of the existing licensed premise (Main Building).
2. All purchases of alcohol must be delivered to and stored in the licensed area.
3. Separate accounting must be maintained for each entity.

STIPULATIONS

1. License valid from May 15th through October 15th, yearly
2. Hours of Operation – 11:00 a.m. until 11:30 p.m.
3. Recorded music will be allowed to a level that will not be disruptive to the neighbors.
4. No live entertainment will be allowed.
5. Occupancy is limited to Seventy-Five (75) patrons within this area
6. Besides the bartender(s) and wait staff, a manager will be on site at all times to monitor the flow of alcohol.
7. Drinks may only be consumed within the licensed area. Alcohol may not be brought out of or into this area from the restaurant (The Edge).

1. PETITION - Trans. # 226 – Plot # 130A-1

Nar Fuel, Inc. d/b/a Hi Lo Gas, Ghada Hamzeh President, who is petitioning for a **New Retail Package Store Wine and Malt Only Beverages License**. Ghada Hamzeh is the President, Secretary, Co-Director, and Co-Shareholder (50%), and **Adel Eldehni** is the Treasurer, Co-Director, Co-Shareholder (50%), and **Proposed Manager**. The proposed licensed premises is a convenience store located in a street level building in an area approximately 1,400 sq. ft., which will include a walk-in cooler for the storage of alcohol, as well as three (3) coolers and shelving for the sale and display of alcohol; the area also includes an office, two (2) storage rooms, and one (1) restroom. There is one (1) entrance/exit in the front of the building, as well as one (1) additional exit located on the south side of the building.

The premise is situated on the corner of Chaffee Street and Acushnet Avenue, **and numbered 2780 Acushnet Avenue**.

Final approval will require a ‘**Certificate of Inspection**’ from the Building Department and a ‘**Food Permit**’ from the Health Department.

Application has been advertised; Abutters have been notified.

Minutes of 04/22/14 Meeting

Present: Atty. Joseph P. Fingliss along with Adel Eldehni, Proposed New Manager

Atty. Fingliss, speaking on behalf of his client, stated that his client has been told by a number of his customers of their desire to be able to buy beer and wine, if he had it available; and based on those requests; he was requesting approval of a ‘new’ retail package store wine & malt license.

Chairman Beauregard informed Atty. Fingliss that the Board applies the 7 Ballarin Factors when considering the granting of a ‘new’ license, of which the first item is the consideration of the number of existing dispensaries in a locality as it relates to “public need”. Chairman Beauregard questioned whether there was a “public need” for another license in that area, and asked Mr. Nanopoulos if he knew how far away the other three (Lyndon’s, Finest, & Trio) retail package stores were from the new location being proposed; Chairman Beauregard was of the opinion that 2 of the 3 (Finest & Trio) were about a mile away.

Mr. Nanopoulos informed the Board that he did not have that information and did not want to speculate on the

distance.

Commissioner Craig asked if the Board could table taking any action on the application until they could be provided with that information, to which Mr. Nanopoulos responded, you have that option.

When asked, Atty. Fingliss stated that he did not have that information as well, and added that he would gather that information in time for the next meeting, if it was the Board's intention to table the matter.

Mr. Nanopoulos informed the Board that he would get the requested information from the Planning Board Office immediately, if they were to vote to table the matter to the next meeting.

The Board was in agreement that they needed to review that additional information prior to making any decision on the application that was before them.

Voted: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to table the matter to the Board's next meeting (May 19th), with a request that the information relative to the location of the other three retail package stores in the area, be provided to the Board as soon as possible. – **Unanimous**

Present: *Atty. Joseph P. Fingliss along with Adel Eldehni, Proposed New Manager*

Mr. Nanopoulos reminded those present as to why the petition was tabled at the last meeting by stating that the Board had some questions regarding the proximity of the other retail package stores to the location of the new retail package store license being requested in the petition that was before them; Mr. Nanopoulos stated that he had the Planning Board prepare the information that the Board had requested, and that it was submitted to the Board.

When asked by Mr. Nanopoulos if he had any new information to present to the Board, Atty. Fingliss stated, when we were here before the Board the last time, there were some concerns about the close proximity of the other existing licenses within one (1) mile to the applicant ... we did a building search ... and what we determined was ... there is one location which is .78 miles, which is Finest Liquors located at 889 Ashley Boulevard ... there was another one that was at 1.18 miles away on Belleville Avenue ... and there was another one that was over two miles away on Acushnet Avenue ... but speaking basically on the request of the Board ... there was just that one ... Finest Liquors that was within one mile away from the applicant. Atty. Fingliss continued, we also have some other information that may be helpful to the Board ... we have a petition signed by approximately 600 people from the neighborhood ... stating that they want it in their neighborhood in that area ... which we would like to submit to the Board. The Board voted unanimously to receive the signed petition and place it on file. Atty. Fingliss concluded his remarks by stating, we also did one last thing ... I understand the concerns of the Board regarding the concentration of liquor licenses in a particular area ... it was determined that there's approximately 4,754 people in that one mile radius ... which is being serviced by that one liquor license at this time ... so that's just a little bit more information we wanted to give to the Board ... so there are almost 5,000 people in that area ... and that information was taken from the U.S. Census Bureau of the census taken from a one mile radius from his address.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard if the Board had any further questions for the applicant, upon seeing and hearing none, Chairman Beauregard called for a motion.

Voted: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to approve the petition as presented, and to forward the application to the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission for their approval; with the stipulation that Mr. Eldehni submit a copy of his T.I.P.S. Certification to the Licensing Board office within thirty (30) days of receiving final approval or prior; and that all of his employees be 'certified' as well, with copies of their certifications to be kept on file for review, if needed, **the motion passed on a 2-1 vote, with Chairman Beauregard opposed, based on his opinion that there was a lack of a public need.**

VOTED: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to remove Item # 2 from the table. – **Unanimous**

Tabled at 04/22/14 Meeting

2. PETITION - Trans. #078 – Plot # 52--229

Almost Brothers, Inc. d/b/a Hibernia Pub, Barry (Bartholomew) W. Flynn, President, who is petitioning to transfer a General on Premise All Alcoholic Beverages License to Carrig, Inc. d/b/a Hibernia Brew Pub, who is also requesting approval of a Pledge of the General on Premise All Alcoholic License to the New Bedford Economic Development Council, 1213 Purchase Street, N.B., MA. as security to authorize and

execute a promissory note in the amount of **One Hundred and Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$135,000.00)**, pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws Ch.138 s.23. **Barry (Bartholomew) W. Flynn** will be the President, Sole Director, a Co-Shareholder (50%), and the **Proposed Manager**; and Catherine Flynn will be the Treasurer, Secretary, and a Co-Shareholder (50%). Premises will remain the same at **109 William Street**.

Final approval will require a '**Change of Tenant**' from the **Building Department**, a new '**Food Permit**' from the **Health Department**, a new signed '**Fire & Building Certificate**' as required under the Chapter 304 Fire Acts Compliance; along with a **new copy of 'Proof of Liquor Liability'**.

Minutes of 04/22/14 Meeting

Present: *No one was required to appear based on the applicant's failure to complete their application.*

Mr. Nanopoulos informed the Board that Mr. Flynn failed to submit the following documents that were needed to complete his application:

1. Petition for a Change of License – Pledge of License
2. New Vote Including Pledge of License
3. P & S Agreement
4. Assignment of License
5. Pledge Agreement
6. Promissory Note
7. DOR Certificate of Good Standing from Almost Brothers, Inc.

Mr. Nanopoulos recommended to the Board that they table the matter until its next meeting (May 19th), in order to give Mr. Flynn 30 additional days to submit the missing documents to complete his application; and added, if the applicant fails to submit the missing documents in time for the next meeting, then the applicant would have to re-advertise his application, which would require an additional \$175.00 advertising fee.

Voted: Commissioner Almeida, based on the information provided by Mr. Nanopoulos, made a motion to table the matter to the Board's next meeting (May 19th). – **Unanimous**

Present: *Barry W. Flynn, Owner*

Mr. Nanopoulos informed the Board that Mr. Flynn had dropped off some documents earlier in the day, but the following documents were still needed to complete his application:

1. Pledge Agreement
2. Promissory Note
3. DOR Certificate of Good Standing from Almost Brothers, Inc.

Based on Mr. Flynn's assurance that he would have all the missing documents by the end of the week, Mr. Nanopoulos recommended to the Board that they table it one last time; but if the missing documents were not received in time for the next meeting, then the application would have to be re-advertised once the missing documents were submitted.

Voted: On a motion by Commissioner Almeida, the Board **voted unanimously to once again table any action on the matter until the Board's next meeting on June 23, 2014**; and instructed Mr. Flynn, that the three missing documents must be submitted by June 16th in order for the petition to be considered for approval by the Board at its next meeting. – **Unanimous**

VOTED: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to remove Item # 3 from the table. – **Unanimous**

Tabled at 04/22/14 Meeting

3. Hearing: United Fisherman's Club, Inc.

Jack Custodio, Manager

639 Orchard Street

You are hereby notified that **your presence** and that of the **Club's Bookkeeper** is required at a hearing to determine whether you have violated certain provisions of M.G.L. Ch. 138, sec. 64-Failure to Comply with the Laws of the Commonwealth, To Wit: M.G.L. Ch. 138, sec. 12 & 26, as follows:

1. An application must be filed to obtain approval from the local licensing authority and the ABCC

for a Change (New) of Officers and Directors.

2. Each Corporate Licensee shall appoint a manager (by a properly authorized and executed written delegation) who shall have full authority and control of the premises and who shall be satisfactory to the Board, and who shall be a United States citizen. Immediate notice of the appointment must be made to the Board in writing.

As well as your failure to comply with the requirements set by this Board with regard to hall rentals and special events, which require the filing of a 'Hall Rental Agreement' for all events held in your hall, as well as applying for police details in the club's name; these conditions were reviewed with you at this Board's November 18, 2013 meeting, at which time Atty. (Christopher) Markey stated the following on your behalf:

"He is under the understanding of the probation requirements and the bookkeeper is as well, that they are to notify the Director as to who is renting out the hall ... and provide that information to the Board ... as well as the need to hire a police detail every time it's rented out. Mr. Custodio knows of those conditions ... he understands that he can't have a promoter come in and do that ... so he's fully aware of that ... he's fully aware that he's to put the Director on notice as to who is coming in for what purposes of renting out the facility."

Please be advised that your failure to appear before this Board as requested may result in the suspension of your General on Premise All Alcoholic Beverages License until compliance is met.

Minutes of 03/24/14 Meeting:

Following the public hearing of March 24, 2014, at which time the above stated issues were discussed at length, this Board voted unanimously to table the matter to the Board's April 22, 2014 meeting. The Board also warned the licensee that if a complete application was not submitted to the Office of the Licensing Board for the required changes **by Friday, April 4, 2014**, the Board would vote to suspend their license until an appropriate application was submitted.

Minutes of 04/22/14 Meeting:

Present: Jack Custodio, President and Current Manager along with Mark Custodio, Proposed New Manager
Chairman Beauregard re-opened the hearing by expressing his displeasure and concern that this matter is being delayed once again due to the 11th hour resignation of Mr. Pimentel; as well as the 'club's' failure to secure a DOR Certificate of Good Standing to complete the application.

Chairman Beauregard, stated to both Mr. Custodio and his son, the Board has attempted to work with the 'club' and has made every accommodation possible to resolve this matter since December of 2011; and that the Board has extended a 'courtesy' to this 'club' that no other licensee has received, and we still do not have an application before us that is complete and acceptable to this Board, for their approval.

Chairman Beauregard continued his remarks by stating, you were warned by this Board that if a complete application was not submitted to the Office of the Licensing Board for the required changes by Friday, April 4, 2014, the Board would vote to suspend your license until an appropriate application was submitted; I think this Board has been more than fair with the time they have given the 'club' to resolve this issue, and I think the Board has been put in a position that it does not want to be in, in which it has to take action, based on the matter being delayed once again.

Upon discussing the matter further with those present on behalf of the 'club', as well as listening to input from Atty. Markey, the Board was in agreement that the licensee has been given more than sufficient time to resolve this matter, and that it hadn't met the April 4th deadline that had been set by the Board at its March 24th meeting; Commissioner Almeida stated he was going to make a motion to suspend the license until this matter is resolved.

VOTED: Upon discussing the matter with its legal counsel; a motion **to suspend the General on Premise license effective May 13, 2014, if in fact a completed application is not submitted by May 12, 2014, including a Certificate of Good Standing from the Department of Revenue** was made by Commissioner Almeida and seconded by Commissioner Craig. **It was unanimously approved.**

Present: Jack Custodio, President and Current Manager along with Mark Custodio, Proposed New Manager; Antonio F.D. Cabral, State Representative

Mr. Nanopoulos informed the Board that a 'new' application was submitted by the May 12th deadline, but the Certificate of Good Standing from the Department of Revenue still has not been received, which was a condition of the Board's decision of April 22, 2014 to suspend the United Fishermen Club's license until a

complete application was submitted; therefore, based on the 'clubs' failure to meet the Board's deadline, the suspension was in effect based on the Board's 04/22/14 vote.

Chairman Beauregard opened the hearing by stating, I did speak to Representative Cabral and Albino Dias this afternoon, and they informed me that they went up and delivered a check to Boston ... and Representative Cabral left me a message this afternoon informing me that the check was delivered to the Department of Revenue ... and they anticipate that in a short period of time ... they we will have the Certificate of Good Standing delivered to us ... so I would recommend that we table the start of the suspension until the Board's next meeting on June 23, 2014.

VOTED: Based on the licensee's assurance and that of State Representative Cabral, that the 'club' had satisfied all of his DOR issues, and that the DOR Certificate of Good Standing would be received within Ten (10) Days; the Licensing Board, on a motion by Commissioner Almeida, voted to hold their decision of 04/22/14, in which it suspended the General on Premise license effective May 19, 2014, in abeyance until its June 23, 2014 meeting. – **Unanimous**

Voted: Since the DOR Certificate hadn't yet been submitted, Commissioner Almeida made a motion to table the matter to the Board's next meeting (June 23rd). – **Unanimous**

4. PETITION - Trans. #109 – Plot # 19--53

United Fishermen Club, Inc., Jack Custodio, President, who per a vote taken at the Annual 'Club' Meeting held on December 29, 2013, is petitioning for a **Change of Officers, Directors, and Manager** of the **General on Premise All Alcoholic Beverages License**. Upon approval, the New Officers and Directors will be as follows: Jack Custodio will remain as the President and a Co-Director, Paulo Vieira and Mark Custodio will serve as Vice – President and a Co-Director, Manuel Gil will be the Treasurer and a Co-Director, John Santos will be the Secretary and a Co-Director, and Antonio Afonso will be a Co-Director, respectively: **Mark Custodio** is the **Proposed New Manager**. Premises will remain the same at **639 Orchard Street**.
Advertisement & Abutters Notification not required.

5. APPLICATION, "Representation Required" - 'NEW LOCATION'

New Bedford Folk Festival Committee, Jaime Kelly, Event Technical Director, who is requesting approval of an application for a **Special One Day Wine & Malt Only Beverages License** for a **'New Bedford Folk Festival'**, to be held within the Bank Five Parking Lot located off Spring Street; and to be held on **Saturday, July 5, 2014 and Sunday, July 6, 2014, from 12:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. (Last Call @ 6.30 p.m.)** (*Final approval will require Liquor Liability with the City named as additionally insured and a copy of the Police Detail Contract*)

Present: *Jaime Kelly, Event Technical Director along with Helen Korolenko, Event Organizer*

Responding to questions from Chairman Beauregard, Ms. Kelly stated that this is the first time that they would be using this space, and added that they used to have it in Custom House Square, but obviously, it's not appropriate any more; so we moved it to the Bank Five parking lot.

Ms. Kelly then proceeded to review the layout of the lot that was submitted to the Board by stating, the whole L-shape lot will be totally enclosed, and will have a music tent with a stage, and a 10' X 10' area for beer sales only; and we've already met with Capt. Cordeiro and Officer Pavia ... and we've made arrangements for police details for the whole festival, as well as for the Bank Five parking lot, which will have 2 detail officers assigned to it.

Responding to questions from Chairman Beauregard, Ms. Kelly stated that there would be two entrances to the lot in general ... one at Union Street and one at Spring Street ... but there will only be one entrance/exit into the area where the stage is and where the beer is ... and that's done by crowd control barriers at which a police officer will be assigned ... so no one will be able to leave the area with beer ... it must be consumed in the enclosed area.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard who would be providing and serving the alcohol, Ms. Kelly stated that Freitas Package Store would be serving the alcohol, which is being purchased through Colonial Beverage who is one of their sponsors.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to how many people were they anticipating, Ms. Kelly stated, I honestly don't have a clue but we did not do it last year ... we did two years ago before that ... but I don't think we sold more than 1,000 cups of beer over the course of the whole weekend.

Voted: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to accept the 'security plan' and approve the application as presented. – **Unanimous**

6. APPLICATION, "Representation Required" – 'NEW EVENT'

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to how they planned to control the access in and out, Ms. Pacheco stated that they would have barrier fencing which would secure their entire area so there would be no reason for any people to come in and out, even the toilets will be located within the enclosed area; and we will also have a police detail along with our own security who will be stationed at the two access points.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to who would be providing the alcohol, Ms. Pacheco stated that Freitas Package Store would be doing the pouring.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to how many people they were expecting, Ms. Pacheco responded that they were expecting 600-700 people.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to how many police officers they planned on hiring, Ms. Pacheco responded, we've hired six (6).

Voted: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to accept the 'security plan' and approve the applications as presented along with the requested rain dates. – **Unanimous**

Responding to questions from Chairman Beaugard, Mr. Phillips stated that the shark tournament was a non-profit event, which is essentially replacing the Montauk Shark Tournament that was previously held on Martha's Vineyard, and we want to showcase the City of New Bedford ... it will be a tournament that will help support sustainable fishing ... as part of that ... we're going to be having a banquet, which is customary at the conclusion of these types of events ... there will be food ... and it will be held on Pope's Island under a tent ... and the area will be set up in a manner very much like the Schwartz Center event is set up ... there will be one entrance where staff members will be checking I.D.'s and issuing wristbands ... and there will be one entrance in and one exit out with the appropriate barriers set up ... and we will also have three detail officers on duty ... and alcohol will only be sold at the event on Saturday night the 19th.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to who would be providing the alcohol, Ms. Richardson stated that L. Knife & Sons would be providing the alcohol along with Papas Pillar, who will be providing a specialty rum; and that Jason Silva would be doing the pouring for L. Knife, and Chris Gifford would be doing the pouring for Papas Pillar, who is also a sponsor for the event; and that both the pourers are T.I.P.S. Certified.

When asked if they planned on having a band, Ms. Richardson stated that they were looking into having a one

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to the location of 1157 Acushnet Avenue, Mr. Dias responded, it's located right near the beginning of Acushnet Avenue, which used to be the old 'Center Theater'.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to how they planned to incorporate an event there on the same weekend as the Day of Portugal, Mr. Dias responded, last year we did an open house and it drew a couple of hundred more people to the Day of Portugal; and the event is to showcase the building and to show the work that's been done inside so far; and we're also looking at this as a collaboration type event with the Day of Portugal, to help draw more people to the Day of Portugal event as well.

Mr. Dias added, our intent is have our visitors go in so we can showcase what we've been doing, and at the same time use it as a fundraiser, because we definitely need to raise some funds to continue our work.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard if they had run this by the Day of Portugal Committee and were they on Board with this, Mr. Dias responded, yes ... we met with them ... and we sent them a letter as well, showing our interest in collaborating with them ... but as far as having us included in the premises ... they were going to look into seeing if they could close the street ... but somehow they couldn't get that incorporated ... so we're going to continue to do that.

When asked by Chairman Beaugard as to what their plan was with regard to the serving of the beer and wine, Mr. Dias responded, it's going to be served inside the premises ... we're going to have tables and chairs set up ... so people can just mingle.

A written request was submitted by The Royal Front & Union Neighborhood Association, Jason P. Lanagan, Representative, who's requesting to hold a "Block Party" within a closed portion of Union and Front Streets. The event is scheduled for Saturday, June 21st and Sunday, June 22nd from 2 p.m. until 6 p.m., with last call at 5:30 p.m. Those participating will be the Rose Alley Ale House, Cork, Slainte, & Pier 37, who will be setting up satellite Beer and Wine stations on the street. There will also be entertainment offered on a stage at the bottom of Union Street, which will include local jazz, rock & roll, and a DJ. They plan on having six (6) detail officers on site, as well as other staff present to check I.D.'s. There will be a \$10.00 cover charge with a portion of the proceeds to benefit the Jacob's Foundation.

Note: The following 'Stipulations & Guidelines' were provided by the Executive Director of the ABCC:

The New Bedford Local Licensing Authority can issue a Chapter 138 Section 14 "Special One Day License" to any individual for this event. Please refer to the guidelines stated below.

- 1.) The applicant for a special one day license must state the area that the alcohol will be served in and be limited to that area only, once approved by the LLA.
- 2.) If the applicant is a "for-profit", entity they are limited to beer and wine only (Only non-profit applicants can be issued an all alcohol one day license.).
- 3.) All alcohol for this event must be purchased directly from an approved source "Wholesalers, etc." and not from a section 15 "package stores" or a section 12 "restaurants" (Alcohol from restaurant stock cannot be used).
- 4.) If an applicant for a one day license is presently a section 12 or 15 license holder all alcohol (beer and

wine only) must be purchased from a wholesaler, and handled individually from their present alcohol.

- 5.) Any existing licensed premises in the block party “one day licensed area”, cannot allow any alcohol that is purchased on the street, to be brought into their existing licensed premises and the same goes for alcohol that is purchased in a section 12 or 15 license (on) premise, it cannot allow any alcohol to leave the premises and be brought onto the “one day license area”.

Present: Jason P. Lanagan and Barry W. Flynn, Representing the Royal Front & Union Neighborhood Association

Mr. Lanagan opened the meeting by stating to the Board, there are a couple of corrections since I filed my request with the Board that Angela Johnson sent over ... one is that they canceled the Summer Sound Series “Block Party” for that evening ... and they’ve asked to do our ‘block party’ on June 21st from 4 p.m. until 8 p.m.

In response, Chairman Beauregard stated, they went to the City Council for a street closing from 4 p.m. to 9 p.m. with no permit for alcohol, which overlaps what you want to do, to which Mr. Lanagan responded, right, that’s why it seems inconsistent; but in Angela Johnson’s e-mail, whose with the NBEDC, she recommended that we move the time from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. on June 21st and to keep it on the 22nd from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Chairman Beauregard responded, to be clear, you are now requesting 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. on the 21st and 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. on the 22nd, to which Mr. Lanagan responded, that’s correct.

Chairman Beauregard then asked Mr. Lanagan to give the Board an overview of what they were planning to do, to which Mr. Lanagan responded, we were approached by NBEDC and the city to do kind of a ‘block party’ to re-launch lower Union Street and Front Street ... after a couple of years of heavy road work and construction ... and this was the idea we came up with ... so the city is going to put up a stage at the bottom of lower Union Street blocking off Union Street and Route 18 ... we will also be blocking off Union Street at the Krueger lot ... we will be blocking off Front Street at the bottom of Rose Alley ... and blocking off Front Street at the property line of 94 Front Street, which is the Rose Alley Ale House ... so it would create a contained L-Shaped area along Front Street ... and it’s just music ... and beer and wine ... and Ahha is putting together a number of artists who will be selling art on the sidewalk ... so it’s just your standard ‘block party’ ... and one other correction is that all of the \$10.00 cover charge will be going to the Jacobs Foundation ... since the other administrative costs for details and other costs are being paid elsewhere ... so all the money collected will be going to the N. B. Educational Foundation.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard as to how they planned to block off the area and designate the area, Mr. Lanagan responded, the number of detail officers we listed will have Police Officers at each street closure ... we typically block those streets off with city provided gates and barriers ... so will have at least one and two Police Officers at the actual street closures ... there will be two officers ... at least one staff member from each participating restaurant ... and there will be a staff member from the Jacobs Foundation at each road closure ... checking I.D.’s ... collecting money.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard as to what kind of barriers they planned to use to close off the top of Union Street, Mr. Lanagan responded, the metal ones or the ones you can fill up ... the plastic ones.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard as to how and where would the I.D. checks be done, Mr. Lanagan responded, I.D.’s will be checked at each point of egress at the top of Union Street ... at the bottom of Rose Alley and Front Street ... on Front Street at the property line of Rose Alley ... and at the bottom of lower Union Street ... at each of the four points of egress.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard, so none of these four pouring stations will be checking I.D.’s, Mr. Lanagan responded, they can but we’re hoping to get people as they entered into the blocked off area ... we’re going to have officers ... staff from the different restaurants doing the I.D. checks because these are the people that work the doors ... so they’d be checking the I.D.’s before they enter the ‘block party’ area.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard as to how many establishments would be serving the alcohol, Mr. Lanagan responded, there will be four ... Slainte Irish Pub ... Pier 37 ... ‘Cork’ ... and Rose Alley Ale House.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard if there would be any differential in cups in order to know who is serving what, Mr. Lanagan responded, we’ve had a number of meetings between the four establishments ... and each establishment would have their own cup ... whether it be branded with their logo ... or color coded ... so each place will have an identifiable cup.

Responding to questions from Commissioner Almeida, Mr. Lanagan stated that they would be issuing wristbands after they've checked the person's I.D. but the wristbands would all be the same color because they will be checked as they enter the 'block party' area rather than by each of the four participating restaurants individually.

When asked by Commissioner Almeida to confirm the times once again, Mr. Lanagan stated that the request was from 4-8 p.m. on Saturday, June 21st and from 2-6 p.m. on Sunday, June 22nd ... and the idea is to bring people into the neighborhood a little bit earlier in the day ... in the hopes that they will kind of stick around ... we're just trying to re-introduce that part of the city to people.

When asked by Chairman Bearegard, you understand that alcohol cannot come in and out of the establishments, Mr. Lanagan responded, correct ... only beer and wine will be sold outside in specific cups; to which Chairman Bearegard responded, and that needs to stay outside ... so you're going to have someone at the doors of the restaurants precluding anyone from getting a drink and walking out ... as well as allowing any drinks purchased outside from being brought into the restaurants ... what's purchased inside ... must be consumed inside ... and what's purchased outside ... must be consumed outside.

When asked by Chairman Bearegard, so each establishment is going to have a doorman posted? Mr. Lanagan responded "correct".

Voted: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to approve the request as amended, with the stipulation that all ABCC Guidelines and Board Stipulations; including those procedures that were agreed to with regard to the flow & control of alcohol, be implemented and enforced. – Unanimous

Note: **The following procedures were requested by the Board, and were accepted by the committee; and must be implemented, along with the ABCC Guidelines listed above:**

(Board Stipulations)

- The hours that were approved by the Board are as follows:
From 4:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m., **with last call being called at 7:30 p.m.** on Saturday, June 21, 2014;
From 2:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m., **with last call being called at 5:30 p.m.** on Sunday, June 22, 2014;
And all alcohol shall not be allowed to be consumed on the street after 8:00 p.m. on Saturday and 6:00 p.m. on Sunday.
- Each applicant is required to submit a copy of their Liquor Liability prior to the issuance of their license, which can be obtained as a "rider" on their existing policy for this event, which should be submitted on an Accord Form; **which should name the City of New Bedford as Additionally Insured, as well as with the dates of the event clearly stated on the form.**

- 'Detail Officers' will be posted at each of the Four (4) locations where the streets are being blocked off, with Two (2) at the top of Union Street just below Water Street, Two (2) at the bottom of Union Street and Front Street, One (1) at the bottom of Rose Alley and Front Street, and One (1) at the end of Front Street between Rose Alley and Centre Street.
- At each of those points, there will be Four (4) staff members from each participating restaurant and One (1) staff member from the Jacobs Foundation checking I.D.'s, and issuing wristbands.
- Each of the Four (4) participating establishments will have their own cups in which the Beer and Wine will be served, which either will be color coded or coded with the establishment's logo, so that each participant will have their own identifiable cup.
- Each establishment will have a doorman posted at the entrance to their establishment to ensure that no alcohol that was purchased inside the licensed establishment is allowed onto the street; as well as ensuring that no alcohol that was purchased on the street is allowed into the licensed establishment.
(Per ABCC Guidelines)
- All servers will be T.I.P.S. certified.

Each restaurant is required to apply for their Special One Day license for June 21st and June 22nd by June 5,

2014, at which time they must submit the \$250.00 licensing fee for each outside bar.

40. Hearing: Pub 6 Social Corp. d/b/a Pub 6 at the Sixth Bristol

Your presence and that of **Jonathan Sylvia, Bouncer** is requested at a hearing to determine whether you have violated certain provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (ABCC) Regulations, and Licensing Board Rules and Regulations as reported by City of New Bedford Police Department. Based on their findings, the Licensing Board may take action to modify, suspend, revoke, or cancel your license.

They are as follows:

Violations: Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 138, sections 34, 34b, 34c-

It is illegal for anyone under the age of twenty-one years to purchase or be in possession of an alcoholic beverage; identification must be checked on the day of service.

Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission Regulation 204 CMR 2.05: (2)-

States no licensee shall permit any illegality to occur on the licensed premises. The licensee is responsible, whether present or not, for ensuring that no disorder, disturbance, or illegality takes place in or on a licensed

premises.

Licensing Board Regulation No. 5, 10, & 12-

Sale of alcoholic beverages, wine and malt beverages to persons under twenty-one years of age is prohibited; Alcoholic beverages shall not be served to a person who is or appears to be intoxicated; Premises must at all times be kept safe.

Summary of Incident

Police Department Incident Report states that units were dispatched to Pub 6 located at 736 Ashley Boulevard, on the report of a fight in progress. Upon arrival, there were two individuals outside of the bar, who, according to the bouncer were the males that were causing a disturbance inside of the bar. The bouncer stated that one of their female friends was highly intoxicated and she was told that they wouldn't serve her; the two males then asked the bartender to give her one more drink and the bartender refused. At this point, the males started to yell and they were told to leave, when they refused, the bouncer stated that he had the bartender call the police. One of the males then picked up a pool cue and the bouncer became concerned that he was going to use it as a weapon, at which point the police arrived.

The bartender stated that he wanted both males barred from coming back, and one of the Officers on the scene printed up a 'No Trespassing' form on both.

Upon getting one of the male's information, it was found that he was underage (19 Yrs. Old); when the bouncer was asked if he had checked the male's I.D., he stated that he did not have an I.D.

Date and time of alleged violations: Friday, March 28, 2014 @ approximately 1:48 a.m. – Police Report #14-3428-OF

Please be advised, failure to appear at this meeting will result in immediate suspension of your liquor license until this matter is resolved.

Present: Atty. Joseph L. Michaud, Representing Pub 6, along with James F. Petitjean, Manager, and Jonathan Sylvia, Bouncer; Capt. Steven Vicente, Liaison to the Licensing Board along with Officer Paul Hodson, Reporting Officer

Upon being asked by Mr. Nanopoulos if his client had received a copy of the 'Hearing Notice', and if he had read the summary contained in the notice, and if he understood why he was requested to appear before the Board based on the summary, and the list of alleged violations contained in the 'Notice', Atty. Michaud stated that he did.

When asked by Mr. Nanopoulos if he wanted him to read the written incident summary contained in the 'Hearing Notice', Atty. Michaud stated that would not be necessary, and waived the reading of the summary. Chairman Beauregard informed the licensee that the reporting officer was present to read, summarize, or give testimony to what was contained in his report, if requested; as well as to answer any questions that the licensee and/or the Board would have for him regarding his report, and what he observed on the night of the incident. Chairman Beauregard then recognized Atty. Michaud to open the hearing.

Atty. Michaud stated on behalf of his client, I'm sure everybody here is familiar with the Sixth Bristol Club ... it's an institution that's been in the city for years ... it's had a long history with no violations that anyone here can recall ... it's a community oriented club that really works at trying to maintain its profile as a responsible place within the city and I think it has successfully done that for many decades ... however, as members of this Board perhaps are aware ... the 'club' is undergoing some growing pains as they modernize their operation there in an attempt to keep the 'club' profitable ... as a result of that, we think that some mistakes have been made ... we're not disputing the facts as alleged in the Officer's Police Report with the exception of whether the gentleman that was told leave ... 'the minor' ... actually had an identification or not ... but we understand that a mistake was made ... we can't undo that but we can try to make an effort to basically adopt different tactics going forward to avoid something like this from happening again in the future ... to that end, the 'club' is re-doubling its efforts to try to address underage youths ... and I'll go over some of the things we're doing right now ... we believe the youth in question gained access to the 'club' through an exit door ... in conjunction with some of his friends who were of age ... and who showed I.D.'s to get into the 'club' ... they then went around to one of the exit doors ... they then opened the exit door and let the youth inside ... because he didn't come through Mr. Sylvia who was checking the I.D.'s of everybody who was coming into the 'club.'

Atty. Michaud outlined the following steps that the 'club' has taken already or will soon be implementing as follows:

1. All the staff will be T.I.P.S. Certified;
2. Additional staff will be on duty on those nights when entertainment will be offered;
3. The additional staffing will be posted at all entrances/exits to ensure that all I.D.s' are checked on those busier nights when entertainment is being offered, as well additional I.D. checks by the bar staff;
4. The 'club' will install video surveillance equipment;
5. The type of entertainment will be changed to hopefully attract an older and much more adult type of clientele.

Atty. Michaud concluded his remarks by stating, we think that these steps that we're taking going forward are hopefully going to address what the concern is ... and everybody in management at the 'club' is very upset by this ... it's not something that we're used to dealing with quite frankly ... so the 'club' has adopted these measures that we hope will be enough to certainly avoid having something like this happen again in the future ... that's what the 'club' will be doing going forward.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard if he had anything he wanted to add, Officer Hodson stated, the only thing I want to say is that when I asked to speak to the person who was found to be underage, he stated that the bouncer didn't check his I.D. but he did have an I.D. on him that showed that he was not of age; but I don't know what door he came in through; and added, he was arrested later on for urinating across the street in a public place.

Atty. Michaud responded, he's certainly not the type of individual that we want in the 'club' ... and that's why when we looked at ... we said, how could this person have gotten into it ... then we were told that his means of access was through the other door at which a doorman was not stationed ... so we're thinking the surveillance system will probably eliminate that possibility ... as well as not having that youth oriented type of entertainment ... which will probably reduce the risk of underage clientele attempting to gain access to the 'club'.

When asked by Commissioner Craig as to what form of I.D. did the underage youth have, Officer Hodson responded, I believe it was a driver's license that he had but I'm not sure ... it could have been a State I.D. Card ... I don't recall what it was.

When asked by Commissioner Almeida as to how long he's been a bouncer at the Sixth Bristol, Mr. Sylvia responded, five (5) years.

When asked by Commissioner Almeida, now you know you must check all I.D.'s? Mr. Sylvia responded, absolutely!

Prior to making his motion, Commissioner Almeida stated to Mr. Sylvia, you see what could have happened there ... it could have been a catastrophe ... especially when someone has a pool cue in their hands.

VOTED: Upon hearing the testimony presented and considering the changes (as noted above) that the licensee would be implementing to address those security issues that were raised by the Board, as a result of the incident of that occurred on 03/28/14, Commissioner Almeida made a motion to receive the reports and place them on file with no further action at this time; along with a written warning. - **Unanimous**

NOTE: Although the Board took no action, the licensee was reminded once again in their written warning of the following ABCC and Licensing Board Regulations:

Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission Regulation 204 CMR 2.05: (2)-

States no licensee shall permit any illegality to occur on the licensed premises. The licensee is responsible, whether present or not, for ensuring that no disorder, disturbance, or illegality takes place in or on a licensed premises.

Violations: Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 138, sections 34, 34b, 34c-

It is illegal for anyone under the age of twenty-one years to purchase or be in possession of an alcoholic beverage; identification must be checked on the day of service.

Licensing Board Regulation No. 5, 10, & 12-

Sale of alcoholic beverages, wine and malt beverages to persons under twenty-one years of age is prohibited; Alcoholic beverages shall not be served to a person who is or appears to be intoxicated; Premises must at all times be kept safe.
