Calypso Hospitality, LLC d/b/a Fernando’s Grille & Bar, Gregory Kulpinski, Manager of LLC who is petitioning to transfer a Common Victualler (Restaurant) All Alcoholic Beverages License to 161 Highland Avenue, Inc, d/b/a Trio Restaurant; the applicant is also requesting approval of a Pledge of the Common Victualler (Restaurant) All Alcoholic Beverages License to Goulart Square Realty, LLC, as security to authorize and execute a promissory note in the amount of Ninety-Seven Thousand and Nine Hundred Dollars, (\$97,900.00), pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws Ch.138 s.23. Upon approval, Sandra S. Rodrigues will be the President, Treasurer, Secretary, Sole Director, and Sole-Shareholder (100%); and Nevin Benjamin is the Proposed Manager.

The previously approved premises is located on the street level of a Three (3) story building, which includes One (1) dining room approximately 2,000 sq. ft. with a bar, Two (2) Handicapped Restrooms, and seating for approximately Eighty (80) people, a pastry shop, approximately 350 sq. ft., with seating for approximately Ten (10) people; there is also a full kitchen, approximately 650 sq. ft., with the storage of liquor in the basement. There are two (2) main entrances/exits; one (1) into the dining room from Rivet St. and one(1) into the Pastry Shop/Kitchen from Bolton St., and two (2) additional rear exits. The licensed premises also includes a ‘Seasonal Outdoor Patio Area’ approximately 430 sq. ft. (10’ x 43’) to be used as a ‘Sidewalk Café’, which is enclosed by a 4 ft. high resin fence with a decorative lattice panel design, and is to be used for seated dining purposes only. The enclosed area includes Ten (10) tables for the seating of Thirty – Two (32) patrons for dining only, as well as a Hostess Station; and is located on the east side of the building, which is contiguous to the licensed premises. The outdoor area is only accessible by way of an entrance/exit off the main entrance ramp located in the front of the building, and is accessible by ‘Hostess Seating’ only; the area will also be monitored by the hostess and wait staff at all times.

The hours of operation are **daily from 11:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m., at which time all outdoor activity must cease, and shall be in effect from May 1ST through October 30th**, in accordance, and as specified in the City of New Bedford Sidewalk Café Permit Ordinance.

(Ord. Ch. 15, Article VI, sec. 15-100 (B) (Item #'s 8 & 15), and requires yearly approval from the City of New Bedford.

The premise is situated on the corner of Rivet & Bolton Streets **and will remain the same at 418-420 Rivet Street.**

Final approval will require a ‘Certificate of Inspection’ from the Building Department, a ‘Food Permit’ from the Health Department, and a signed ‘Fire & Building Certificate’ as required under the Chapter 304 Fire Acts Compliance; along with a copy of ‘Proof of Liquor Liability’.

2. PETITION - Trans. #083 – Plot # 53—198A

Cultivator Shoals, Inc. d/b/a Cultivator, Jason P. Lanagan, President, who is petitioning for a **Change of Description of the Common Victualler (Restaurant) Wine & Malt Only Beverages License**. Upon completion of the renovations, the licensed area will consist of an area approximately 553 sq ft on the first floor of a three story building, which includes one (1) dining room with table seating for approximately Ten (10) patrons, and a bar with seating for six (6) patrons, along with an enclosed kitchen area.

Responding to questions from Chairman Beauregard, Mr. Lanagan stated that they subdivided the space and now have another tenant at that location, and in doing so, we essentially shrunk down the footprint of the restaurant; so not much would change from an operational standpoint from when we were open before, except that the space would be operating from two different sides, and the design would be a little bit different.

Chairman Beauregard then reviewed the plans that were submitted with Mr. Lanagan.

Responding to further questions from Chairman Beauregard, Mr. Lanagan stated that there would not be any entertainment, and the kitchen hours would be from 11:30 a.m. until 2:00 a.m.

Re: Chapter 304 of the Acts of 2004, An Act Relative to Fire Safety in the Commonwealth

Please be advised that **you are required to attend** a joint meeting of the Licensing Board, Fire Department and Building Department to discuss the requirements of Chapter 304 as it relates to the lack of updated service for your ansul system for your club. We have been informed that your establishment falls under the provisions of this law, and to date, you have failed to meet the requirements of this regulation.

This meeting **is mandatory** in that this issue must be resolved prior to the renewal of your 2015 liquor license. Your failure to comply may result in the non-renewal of your license.

Present: Fred Caton III, Manager along with Scott Boutin and Richard Sterling, Club Officers; Danny Romanowicz, Commissioner of Buildings

MR. Romanowicz informed the Board that the club has an ansul system that they need to either repair it or remove it, in order for the 304 Certificate to be issued for 2015.

Mr. Boutin informed the Board that it was their intention to remove the ansul system, and that the club has met with Capt. Charbonneau, Fire Department, and that they’ve also been in touch with Jim Pappas, Inspectional Services; and that they’ve decided to tear it all out.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard if they plan to use their kitchen, Mr. Boutin responded, we very rarely use it, and for the \$10,000.00 cost to repair and update the ansul system, it’s just not financially feasible to do it.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard as to who would be doing the demolition (removal), Mr. Boutin stated that they

were going to take out the equipment and that John, from Prime Fire Ventilation, would be taking out the ansul system. Mr. Nanopoulos informed the Board that they needed to request a time frame as to when the work would be completed, in order for a 304 Certificate to be issued, or the Board would not be able to sign the 2015 renewal, which would mean a delay in issuing the license.

Mr. Boutin informed the Board and Mr. Romanowicz that he felt the work could be completed by mid December. Mr. Nanopoulos recommended that the matter be tabled to the Board's December meeting on the 22nd.

VOTED: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to table the matter to the Board's December 22nd meeting. – **Unanimous**

Your presence is respectfully requested at a hearing to determine the status of your annual liquor license for the year 2014. The hearing is also being held at the request of the members of this Board to discuss your plans for your liquor license for the year 2014 prior to this Board considering approval of your 2015 renewal application.

If warranted, the Board may cancel the license of any license holder who "ceases to conduct the licensed business" that is, *any license holder who closes the business or stops doing business*. Licensees should be conducting the licensed business on all days authorized by the license. Any licensee that does not comply with its obligation to conduct the licensed business and holds a so-called "pocket License" is subject to possible action by the Board.

Notice is given in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 138, section 77, which states that the licensing authorities may, after hearing or reasonable opportunity therefore, cancel any license issued under this chapter if the licensee ceases to conduct the licensed business.

Minutes of 10/21/13 Meeting

Present: Atty. Greg Koldys along with Jane A. Magan-Askew, Sole Manager of LLC and Proposed New Manager.

When asked by Mr. Nanopoulos as to when they planned to open, Atty. Koldys responded, it's a build out ... but the hope was to open by the beginning of December (2013) ... but obviously the build out is going to take some time ... so we're not actually sure at this time; the plans had been submitted to the Building Department and approved.

Minutes of 07/28/14 Meeting

Present: Atty. Greg Koldys, Representing JAMA, LLC

When asked by Chairman Beauregard as to the current status of the proposed licensed premises, Atty. Koldys stated Ms. Magan was unable to attend tonight's meeting, and that he had a letter stating what Ms. Magan's current position is.

Atty. Koldys stated that he may have misspoke at the prior hearing when he stated that he hoped to be open by the beginning of December (2013), and that he didn't realize that the approval process would take as long as it did; noting that the transfer was not approved until the end of November.

Atty. Koldys referred to the letter in which Ms. Magan states, that they have experienced some delays in the build out of

the proposed premises and the layout of the equipment , which required a new set of plans to be submitted to the Health Department for review; and that they now anticipate a November (2014) opening. A copy of the letter and the new set of plans were submitted to the Board by Atty. Koldys, and unanimously received and placed on file.

The 'new' plans were reviewed with the Board, and it was determined that there was no difference in the basic layout of the premises, therefore, the Licensing Board would not be required to approve the new plans.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard as to where they were with regard to the renovations, Atty. Koldys stated that the new plans were now before the Board of Health, once they're all set with it and how it fits; and that she (Ms. Magan) anticipates opening by November, and that she's very aware that she needs to get open.

VOTED: On a motion by Commissioner Almeida, the Board voted unanimously to table the matter until the Licensing Board's November 17th meeting with the following stipulation:

To notify and put the current Licensee, who is the holder of an inactive license on notice that she has until November 1, 2014 to initiate one (1) of the following three (3) options prior to this date:

- 1.) To be open and operating at the current location;
- 2.) Submit paperwork for a Change of Location and a date certain for the opening of premises;
- 3.) Submit paperwork for the Sale and Transfer of the license to a new owner.

If you fail to initiate one of the three options stated above prior to this date, you will be required to appear before this Board once again, at which time the Board may consider revoking your license for non-use.

You **must submit** to the Board that evening, a letter stating your intentions regarding the license that has been issued to you detailing either an opening date, plans to transfer, or change of location, as it applies to your situation.

If you fail to initiate one of the three options stated above prior to this date, you will be required to appear before this Board once again, at which time the Board may consider revoking your license for non-use.

Present: Atty. Greg Koldys, Representing JAMA, LLC

When asked by Chairman Beauregard to inform the Board of the current status and plans for the inactive license currently held by JAMA, LLC, Atty. Koldys informed the Board that his client has decided not to open the planned restaurant on Mt. Pleasant Street at this point; and stated that his client attempted to come up with a format (layout) for that location but nothing seems to be economically feasible; so she's made the determination at this point to try and sell the license if she has the opportunity to do that, and the time to do that, in order to try to re-coup some of the money she's already invested in it.

He went to state that his client was not looking to sell it for a profit but only to re-coup what she put into it, and that she was also willing to finance the license herself, if need be.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard if she's made any attempt to sell the license up to this point, Atty. Koldys responded, she made some attempts to sell the license as she was still looking at the prospect of maybe trying to put this package together in some different fashion, which would make some economic sense.

When asked as to how long she's had the license, Atty. Koldys responded, just about a year.

When asked if she was prepared to sign and pay the renewal fee, Atty. Koldys stated that she was.

Chairman Beauregard suggested that the Board approve the renewal, and table the matter to the Board March 2015 meeting, in order to put an aggressive time frame on her to move the license.

Mr. Nanopoulos informed Atty. Koldys that the renewal needed to be signed by November 26th.

VOTED: On a motion by Commissioner Almeida, the Board voted unanimously to once again table the matter until the Licensing Board's March 2015 meeting with the following stipulation:

To notify and put the current Licensee, who is the holder of an inactive license on notice that she has until March 1, 2015 to initiate one (1) of the following three (3) options prior to this date:

- 1.) To be open and operating at the current location;
- 2.) Submit paperwork for a Change of Location and a date certain for the opening of premises;
- 3.) Submit paperwork for the Sale and Transfer of the license to a new owner.

If you fail to initiate one of the three options stated above prior to this date, you will be required to appear before this Board once again, at which time the Board may consider revoking your license for non-use.

Williams continued his comment by disputing if it needed to go before site plan review, but went on to state that his client finally decided to go in front of site plan review and they submitted an application today at 3:30 p.m.

Atty. Williams stated that he still plans to put a building up there at some point in time, and that he’s still looking to get another car dealership to put at that location.

Atty. Williams concluded his remarks by requesting that the Board allow them time to see what happens with site plan review, in order to see what type of conditions they put on the site.

Atty. Williams stated that the only thing they didn’t want to see was for this issue to affect his license across the street, because that was his bread and butter; to which Chairman Beauregard responded, it could ... we have to be fair ... we can’t allow him to put cars in there without a license ... and then Roy’s from down the street decides to store cars across the street ... we just can’t allow that.

Atty. Williams stated that he understands but his client just can’t understand why he has to go all through this.

Your presence and that of **Miguel Barbosa, Co-Owner**, is requested at a hearing to determine whether you have violated certain provisions of Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission Regulations and Licensing Board Rules and Regulations. The Board will review the proliferation of calls to service to your establishment, by the New Bedford Police Department. There is great concern regarding the number of late night disturbances and incidents taking place in and around your establishment as well as a report of a minor being found on the premises. The Board has concerns where you were recently warned about these disturbances, yet that continues to occur, which brings into question your ability to provide a safe and secure premise for your patrons.

Upon review of the facts, the Licensing Board may take action to modify, suspend, revoke, or cancel your license; and if warranted, a roll back of hours may be considered.

The potential violations are as follows:

ABCC Regulation 204 CMR 2.05: (2)-

States no licensee shall permit any illegality to occur on the licensed premises. The licensee is responsible, whether present or not, for ensuring that no disorder, disturbance, or illegality takes place in, or on a licensed premises.

Following the public hearing held on October 20, 2014 to determine whether the licensee violated certain provisions of Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission Regulations, and Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, as reported to the N. B. Police Department, the Board, upon hearing the testimony presented, **voted unanimously to table any decision on the hearing that was held until its next meeting on November 17, 2014;** in order to give you an opportunity to submit a "Business/Security Plan" for the Board to review., which must be submitted to the Licensing Board Office by **Wednesday, November 12, 2014.**

Note: This plan should contain information as to how the licensee plans on operating his business, which should include his hours of operation, if food will be served, and the type of entertainment the licensee plans on offering, as well as the days said entertainment will be offered. The plan should also include a detailed security plan, which should include any measures (doorman, police details, cameras, etc.) that the licensee has or plans on implementing to ensure the safety of his patrons and staff.

Present: Miguel Barbosa, Co-Owner; Capt. Steven Vicente, Liaison to the Lic. Bd.

Mr. Barbosa submitted the requested 'Security Plan', which included changes that Mr. Barbosa has implemented or planned to implement, which the Board **unanimously received and placed on file.**

Mr. Barbosa reviewed 'Security Plan' with the Board, of which a copy is on file.

Responding to questions from Chairman Beauregard, Mr. Barbosa stated that his hours currently are from 6 p.m. until 2 a.m. on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays, and that beginning soon, he would also be open on Thursdays during the same hours; he also stated that his kitchen is open until 11:00 p.m. for appetizers only, which he operates himself.

Mr. Barbosa also stated that he would have two people at the door, two security people in the bar, and that he would also be monitoring the bar; and that there would only be entertainment on Fridays and Saturdays.

Chairman Beauregard responded to Mr. Barbosa's proposal by stating, we'll try it out but you have to understand the seriousness with this Board ... but if problems continue down there ... you're going to have issues with this Board ... you need to pay close attention to what's going on over there ... control the crowds ... control the drinking.

Mr. Barbosa stated that he was going to call last call at 1:15 a.m. and at 1:30 a.m. all alcohol consumption would stop; and added, no one would be allowed in after 1:00 a.m.

Upon hearing the testimony presented and considering the 'Security Plan', as well as the additional steps the licensee has taken to address the Board's concerns, the Board, on a motion by Commissioner Almeida, **voted unanimously to receive the reports and place them on file** with no further action at this time.

Although the Board took no action, the Board advised the licensee once again of the following ABCC and Licensing Board Regulations:

The sale of alcoholic, wine and malt beverages to persons under twenty-one years of age is prohibited (I.D.'s must be checked on the day of service.); Alcoholic Beverages shall not be served to a person who is or appears to be intoxicated; Excessive Crowds and Objectionable persons shall not be permitted on or about the premises, and it is the responsibility of the Licensee to enforce this rule; Premises must at all times be kept safe.

City Ordinances:

Section 15-96. Exclusion of minors from liquor establishments during entertainment

No person under the age provided in Massachusetts General Laws (21 yrs. old) shall be present or go upon premises licensed for the sale of alcoholic beverages, if the premises are, or should be, licensed for entertainment, while entertainment is being offered thereon.

The Board also reminded the licensee once again, that if he or his staff feels that they or any of their patrons may be in any danger, they should contact the police immediately.
