The City of New Bedford, Massachusetts, Department of Environmental Stewardship in conjunction with the Purchasing Department (Awarding Authority) invites separate sealed bids for Transportation and Disposal of PCB Remediation Waste Regulated by the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) #15171036 and Non-TSCA Regulated PCB Impacted Fill Materials #15171237. The approximate amount of TSCA Remediation Waste is 1,300 tons, while the amount of Non-TSCA fill material is estimated to be 1,000 tons. These contracts are estimated to cost approximately \$250,000, and \$60,000, respectively.

The work of these contracts is strictly **Transportation and Disposal**; Contract Documents, including Bidding Requirements, General Conditions, Specifications, and Addenda may be seen or examined at the following place during normal business hours, after issuance of the documents. Questions pertaining to specifications must be submitted in writing no later than 4:00 p.m. **Tuesday, November 18, 2014** Questions can be mailed, emailed or faxed. No phone calls accepted.

A prebid conference is not scheduled

All bids shall be accompanied by a bid deposit that is five percent (5%) of the bid amount. Bid deposits may be in the form of Certified Check, Certificate of Deposit, or Bid Bond made payable to the City of New Bedford, Massachusetts.

Attention is directed to the minimum wage rates to be paid on the work as determined by the Commissioner of Labor and Industries under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 149, Sections 26 and 27D inclusive. The successful general contractor and all sub-bidders will be required to submit a certified payroll and a statement of compliance on a weekly basis for review by the party designated by the City of New Bedford.

The Awarding Authority reserves the right to waive any and/or all informalities in the bidding. The Awarding Authority also reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to accept any other than the lowest bidder should it be deemed to be in the best interest of the City of New Bedford, Massachusetts, to do so.
